



## People experiencing homelessness

Alcohol, tobacco and other drugs in Australia

There is a strong association between problematic alcohol or other drug use and experiences of homelessness.[1]



In 2022–23, **3 in 4** (75%) SHS clients who **reported problematic drug and/or alcohol use** were aged **under 45**. [3]

**8.6%** or around **23,500** SHS clients aged 10+ reported **problematic AOD use** in 2022–23. [3]

**60%** of SHS clients with **problematic AOD** use were **homeless** and **40% were at risk of homelessness** on first presentation to support services in 2022–23.[3]



Most common principal drugs of concern for those who sought both Specialist Homelessness Services (SHS) and Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) treatment services in 2011–14 were:



Alcohol (40%)



Cannabis (29%)



**Amphetamines (21%)** [2]

The 2023 **Illicit Drug Reporting System** report showed that for the interviewed injecting drug users, 27% reported homelessness.[4]

Of the **23,500 (8.6%)** SHS clients with **problematic drug and/or alcohol use** in 2022–23, **79%** were **returning clients** while **21%** were **new clients**.[3]
