Domestic life

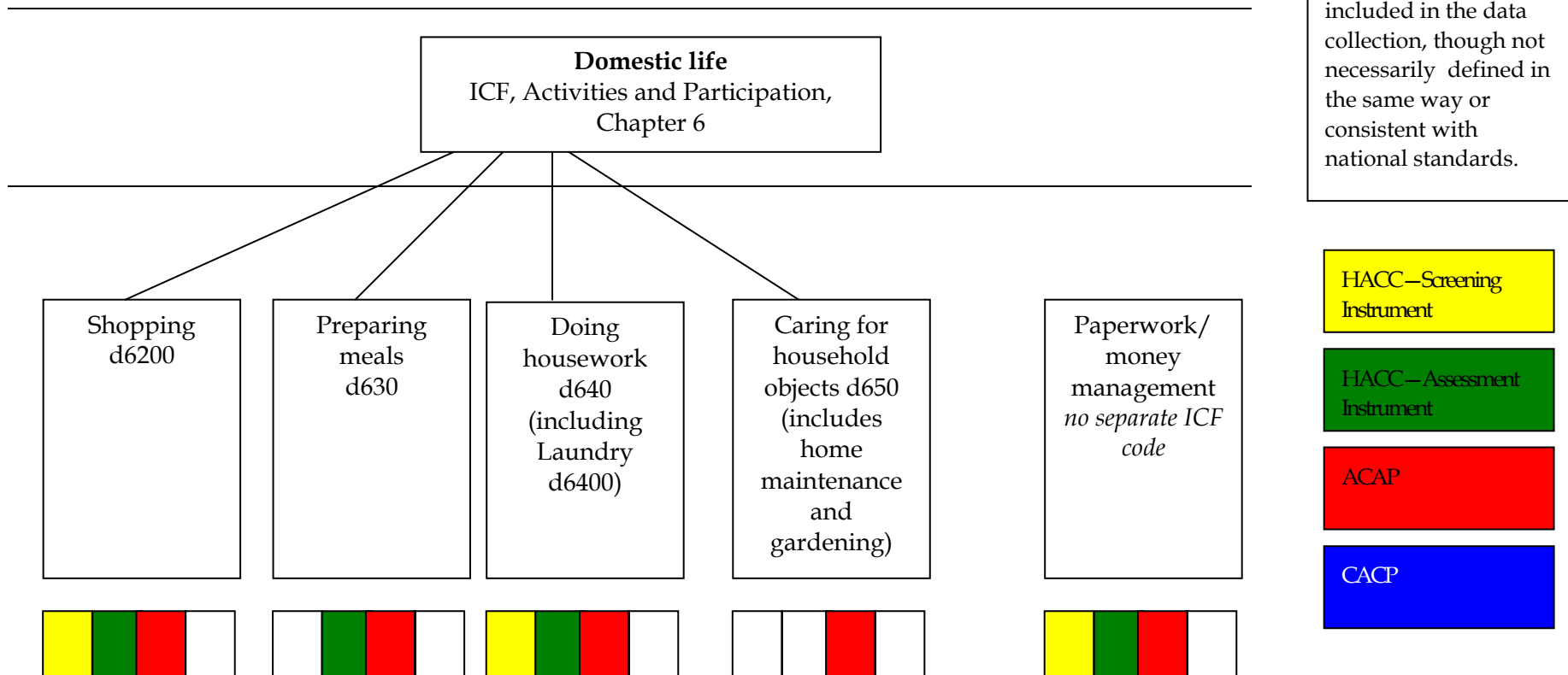

Self-care

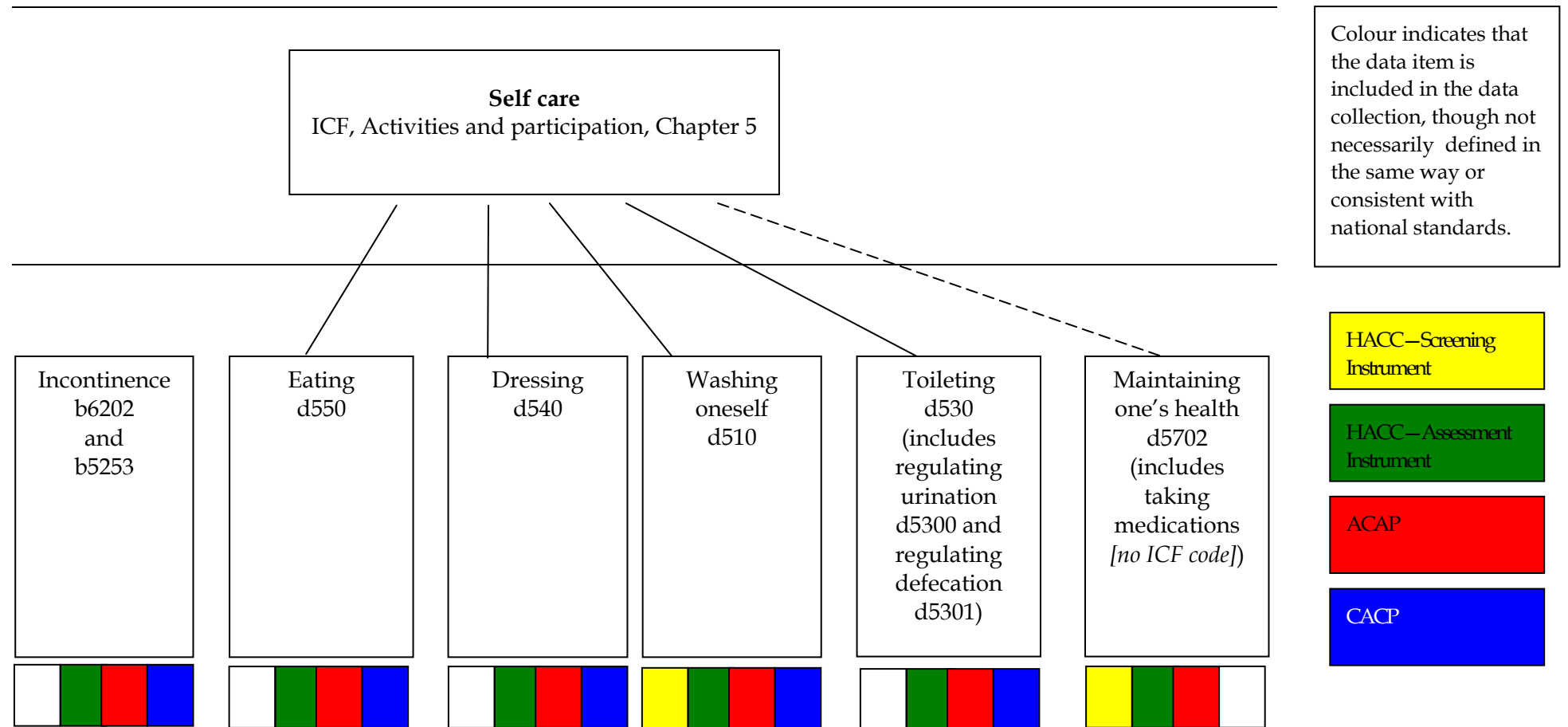

Mobility

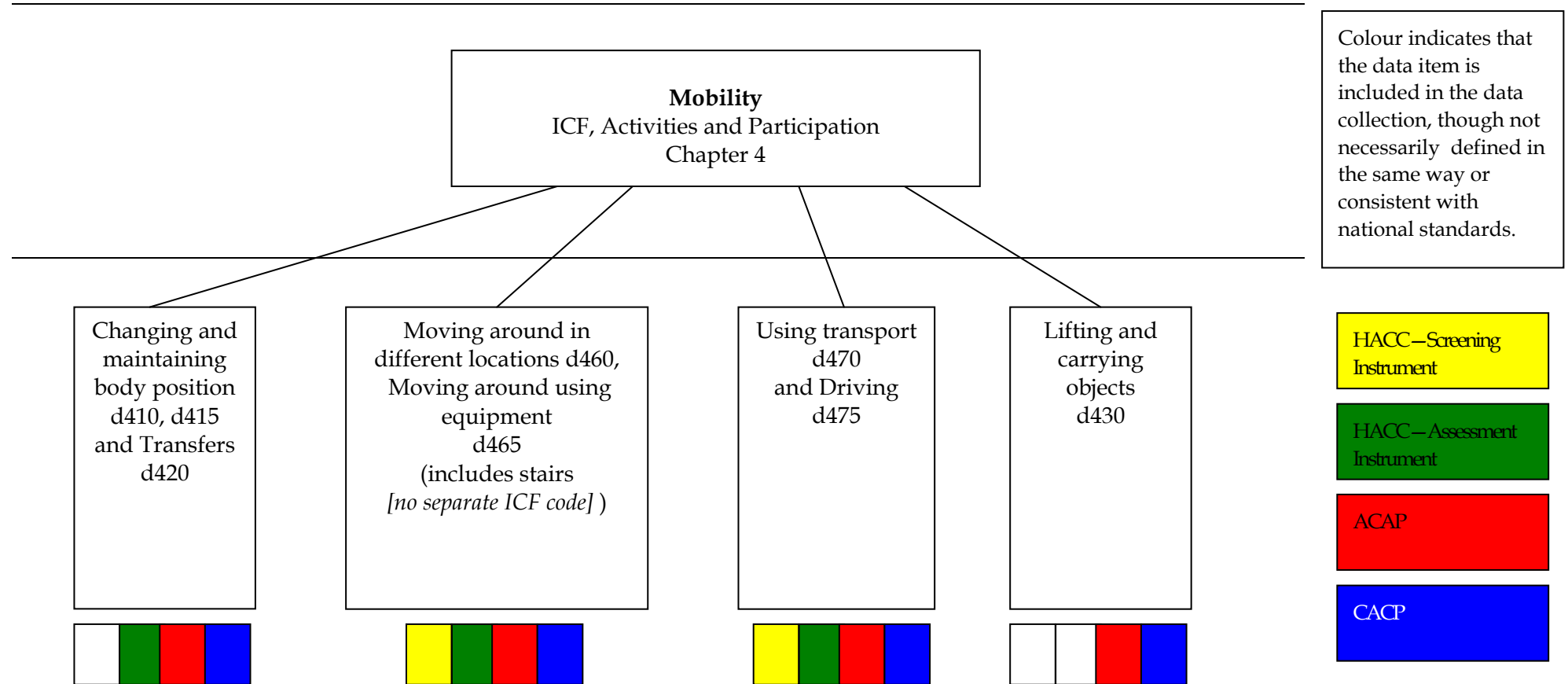
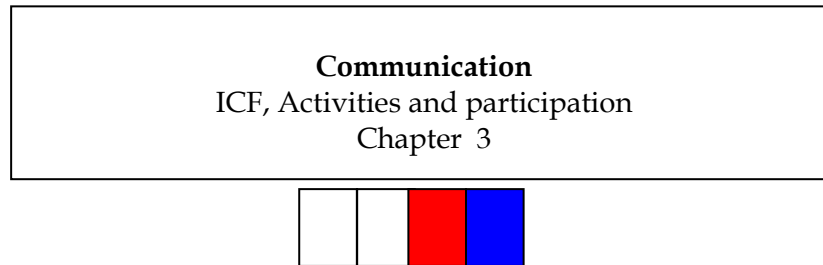

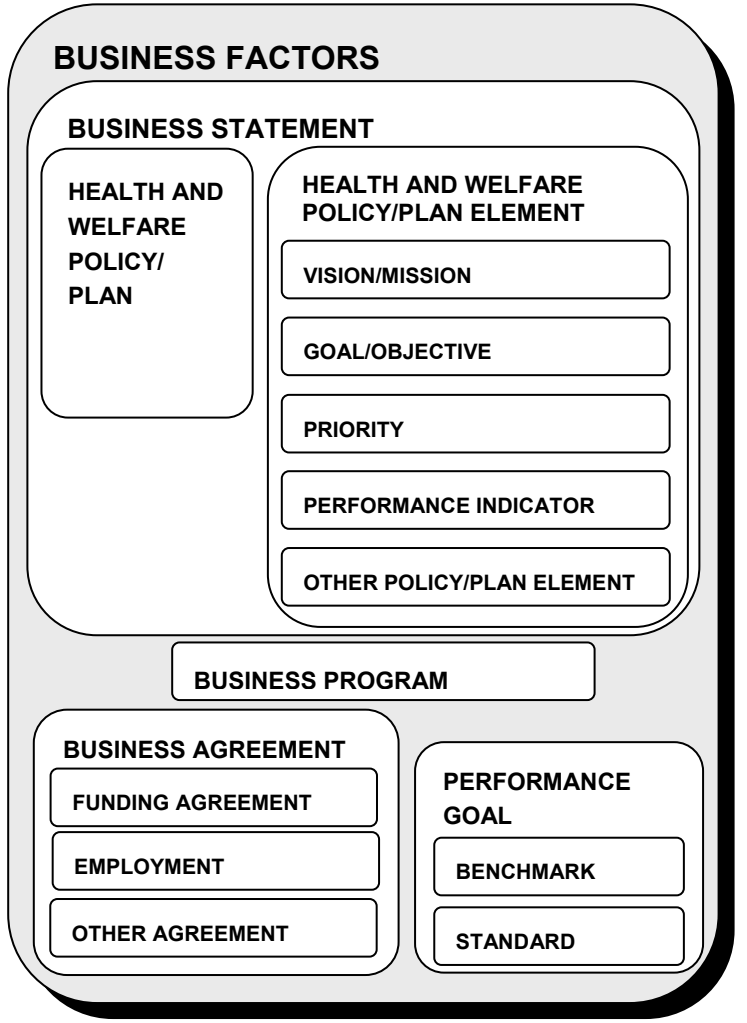
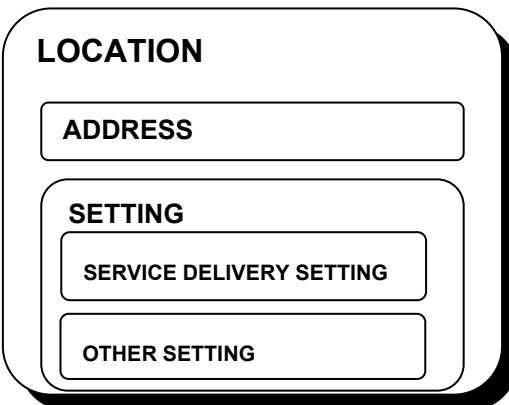
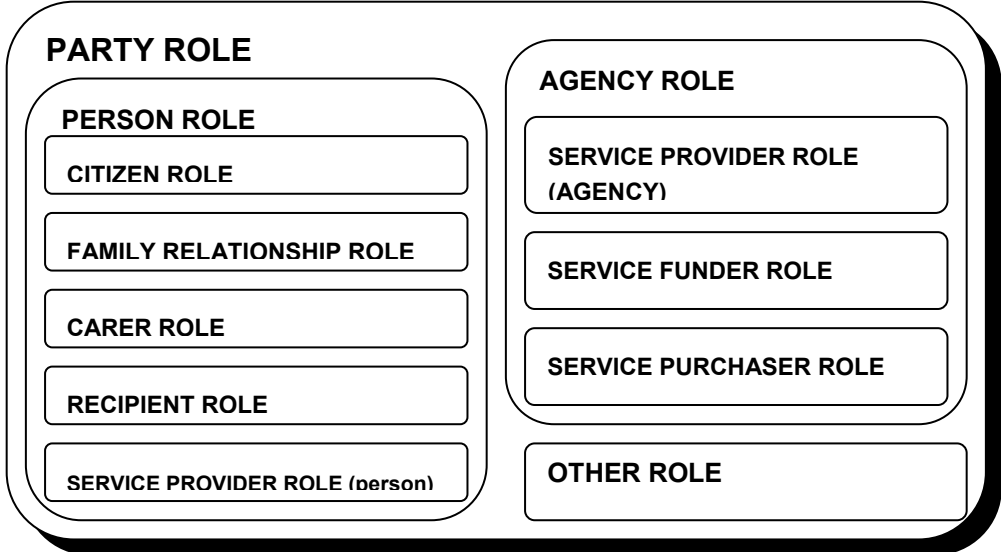
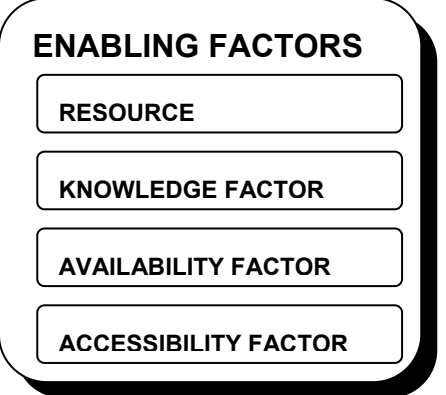
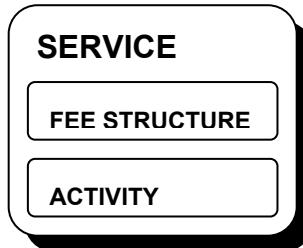
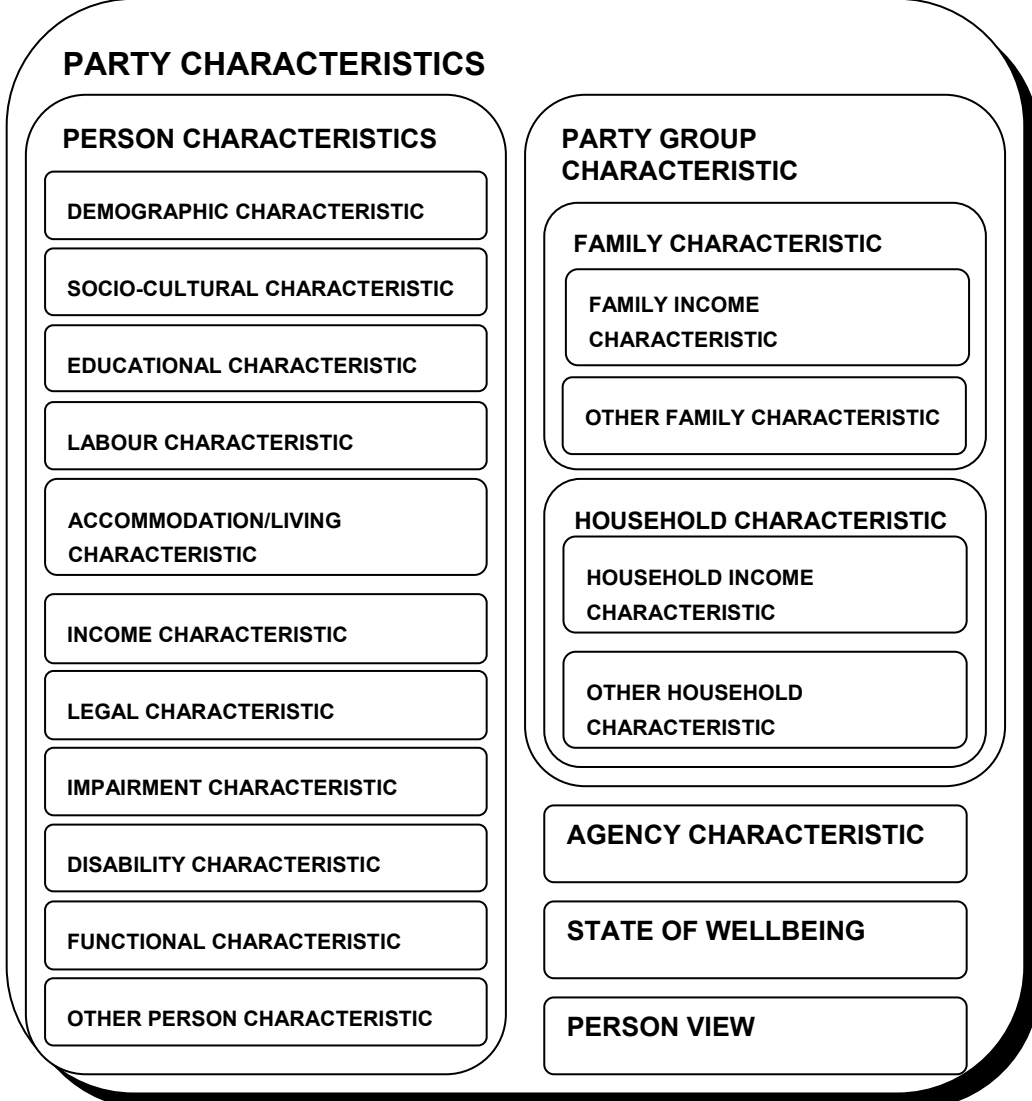
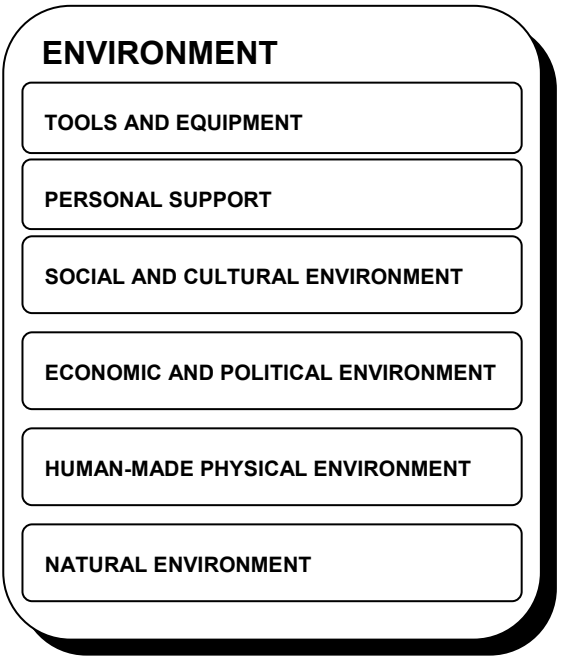
Core activity restriction
