

4 Resident characteristics

Residents at 30 June 2004

There were 147,640 residents in residential aged care services at 30 June 2004, compared with 142,846 residents in aged care services at 30 June 2003 and 134,899 residents at 30 June 1999 (Tables 4.2 and A1.1). Around half (51%) the residents in aged care services at 30 June 2004 were aged 85 years and over. In 1999, 48.6% were aged 85 years and over (Table A1.1). This pattern was very similar across the states and territories, with the exception of the Northern Territory where just 24% of residents were aged 85 years and over. Residents of services in remote and very remote areas also tended to have a younger age profile, with 42% aged 85 years and over in remote areas and 28% aged 85 years and over in very remote areas (Table 4.5).

Nationally, there were 6,378 residents aged under 65 years accommodated in aged care services, comprising 4% of all residents. For the Northern Territory, however, the proportion of residents aged under 65 years was considerably higher at 19% (Table 4.2). A higher proportion in the Northern Territory is to be expected given the higher proportion of Indigenous Australians in the Northern Territory. Aged care planning for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people is based on those 50 years and over in light of their poorer health status. In remote areas, 10% of residents were under 65 years of age whilst in very remote areas 20% of residents were under 65 years of age. In other regions the representation of this age group was near the national average of 4.3% (Table 4.5).

The majority of residents (72%) were female (Table 4.2). Female residents were on average older than male residents: 57% of female residents were 85 years of age or older, compared with 37% of male residents (Table 4.2).

Permanent residents

The majority (98%) of residents in aged care services on 30 June 2004 were permanent residents (144,994). Of these, 51% were aged 85 years and over and 72% were female (Table 4.3).

Marital status

About 98% of permanent residents reported their marital status prior to admission. Of these, 59% were widowed at the time of admission, 24% were either married or in a de facto relationship, 10% had never married and 7% were divorced or separated (Table 4.6). Female permanent residents were over two times more likely to be widowed and over two times less likely to be married or in de facto relationships than their male counterparts.

A lower proportion of permanent residents in the Northern Territory were widowed (48%) than in any other jurisdiction, while a higher proportion of Northern Territory permanent residents were single (16%) or separated (4%).

Indigenous status

Of the 92% of permanent residents for whom data were recorded on Indigenous status, 809 (about 0.6%) identified as Indigenous people (Table 4.8). Only 57% of Indigenous permanent residents were female compared with 72% of non-Indigenous residents. Data on Indigenous status were not available for about 8% of permanent residents.

The Northern Territory reported the highest proportion of Indigenous people among its permanent residents (36%).

Pension status

Most permanent residents were in receipt of a government pension. Seventy-three per cent of residents received a Centrelink pension and 17% an Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs pension (Table 4.10). Female permanent residents are more likely to receive a Centrelink pension (74%) than males (68%). On the other hand, a higher proportion of male residents receive a DVA pension – 21% of males receive this pension compared with 15% of women.

Self-funded retirees comprised 10% of permanent residents. There was little difference between males and females. The Australian Capital Territory had a higher proportion of self-funded retirees (20%) among its permanent residents compared with other states and territories. The Northern Territory (5%) and Tasmania (7%) had the lowest proportion of self-funded retirees.

Country of birth and preferred language

A high percentage of all permanent residents reported their birthplace and preferred language. About 26% of residents were born overseas; 11% were born in the United Kingdom and Ireland, and another 10% in 'other' areas of Europe (Tables 4.11).

Western Australia had the highest proportion of overseas-born permanent residents (38%) and overseas-born respite residents (41%) (Tables 4.11 and 4.12). Tasmania, Queensland and New South Wales had the lowest proportions of overseas-born permanent residents with 15%, 20% and 24% respectively.

Nationally, about 92% of permanent residents indicated that English was their preferred language, while 7% preferred other European languages (Table 4.13). Among permanent residents, the Northern Territory had the highest proportion preferring a language other than English with 30% having this preference (including 22% who preferred an Australian Indigenous language) (Table 4.13). For the other states and territories, the proportion of those who reported a preferred language other than English ranged from 12% in Victoria to 2% in Tasmania.

Respite residents

Only 2,646 residents in aged care services on 30 June 2004 were receiving respite care, representing 2% of all residents (Table 4.4). The age profile of respite residents was younger than that of permanent residents. Only 41% of respite residents were aged 85 years and over, with a further 42% aged between 75 and 84 years. A lower proportion of respite residents were female (63%) compared with permanent residents.

The age-sex profile of respite residents was similar across all states and territories except for the Northern Territory and Tasmania. In the Northern Territory, 22% of respite residents were aged under 65 years and only 11% were aged 85 years and over. The age profile of respite residents was oldest in Tasmania where 90% of respite residents were aged 75 years and over and 49% were aged 85 years and over.

A higher proportion of respite residents were either married or in a de facto relationship (32%) compared with permanent residents (24%) (Tables 4.6 and 4.7). A smaller proportion of respite residents compared to permanent residents were widowed, but this group still comprised more than half of respite residents (55%).

Indigenous status was not reported for 1.5% of respite residents. Of those for whom Indigenous status was reported, 0.7% identified as Indigenous people (Table 4.9).

About 27% of respite residents were born overseas and their country of birth profile was similar to that for permanent residents. Nationally 89% of respite residents indicated that English was their preferred language, while 9% preferred other European languages, especially Southern European languages (Tables 4.12 and 4.14).

Characteristics of newly admitted residents

There were 52,269 people admitted to residential aged care services for permanent care during 2003-04 (Table 4.18), and 33,177 people admitted for respite care during the same period (Table 4.19). People admitted for respite care were slightly younger than those admitted for permanent care, with 65% of respite admissions aged 80 years and over compared with 70% of permanent admissions (Tables 4.16 and 4.17). There has been an increase in the proportion of newly admitted residents aged 80 years and over since 1998-99, when 60% of people admitted for respite care and 64% of people admitted for permanent care were aged 80 years and over (Table A1.2).

Admitted permanent residents were more likely to be married or in a de facto relationship, and less likely to be never married (29% and 8% respectively), when compared with all permanent residents at 30 June 2004 (24% and 10% respectively) (Tables 4.6 and 4.18). While the vast majority of people admitted for both permanent and respite care were either married or widowed, those admitted for respite care were more likely to be married than those admitted for permanent care (34% and 29% respectively) (Tables 4.18 and 4.19).

Most newly admitted residents had been living in a house or flat prior to admission during the reporting period; 73% of permanent residents and 82% of respite residents (Tables 4.20 and 4.21).

Forty-eight per cent of admitted permanent residents lived alone prior to their admission, 44% lived with family and 8% lived with others. It should be noted that the introduction of a new ACAT form in 2003 means it is no longer possible to identify those who lived only with their spouse.

People admitted for respite care differed considerably from those admitted for permanent care with regard to their living arrangements. Those admitted for respite care were more likely, at the time of admission, to be living in the community compared with permanent residents. While people admitted for respite care were less likely to be living alone than those admitted for permanent care, it is noteworthy that 40% of respite admissions were for people living alone at the time of entry (Table 4.23). This was particularly true of women: 47% of women admitted for respite were living alone compared with 26% of men.

The proportion of newly admitted permanent residents who were receiving an Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs pension was higher at 20% than for all permanent residents at 30 June 2004 (17%). The corresponding proportions of people receiving a Centrelink pension were 70% and 73% respectively (Tables 4.10 and 4.24).

Dependency levels

Resident dependency levels are indicated by the Resident Classification Scale (RCS). The RCS has eight categories which represent eight levels of care in descending order of need from 1 to 8. The level of Australian Government care subsidy is based on the level of care need indicated by each RCS category. Categories 1 to 4 represent high care and categories 5 to 8 represent low care.

Among permanent residents on 30 June 2004, 1,088 (0.8%) did not have a current assessment recorded on the database. Of those who did have their dependency level reported, 66% fell into high care categories (RCS 1 to 4) and 34% into low care categories (RCS 5 to 8, Table 4.26). RCS categories 1, 2 and 3 captured the highest proportion of permanent residents (22%, 24% and 14% respectively). The lowest level of care (RCS 8) contained just under 1% of residents on 30 June 2004 (Table 4.26).

Tables 4.27 and 4.28 both examine resident dependency at 30 June 2004 but one table with a focus on younger ages and the other with emphasis on older ages. There were few differences between male and female residents in relation to dependency levels. Younger residents demonstrated a slightly higher level of dependency than older residents, for example, 29% of those under 65 years were in the RCS 1 category as compared with 22% overall (Table 4.27).

Between 30 June 1998 and 30 June 2004, the proportion of residents classified as high care (RCS 1 to 4) rose from 58% to 66%, while those classified as low care (RCS 5 to 8) fell from 42% to 34% (Table 4.1). This decline has been most marked in RCS 8, reflecting an increasing emphasis on providing services to those with personal care needs, rather than primarily accommodation needs. From 1998 to 2004 the proportion in RCS 8 has dropped from 4.5% to 0.8% and the proportion in other low care (RCS 5-7) has dropped from 37.7% to 33.6% (Table 4.1). Available residential care places have thus been targeted to a progressively more dependent group of people. During this same period the supply of Community Aged Care Packages, aimed at providing the equivalent of low care residential support to people still living in their own homes, has expanded significantly. This pattern is in keeping with established government policy which aims to provide a greater proportion of care for people in their homes who would otherwise be eligible for low care residential support.

The dependency profile of newly admitted residents during 2003–04 provides a useful indication of possible future trends in residential care. The dependency levels of admitted permanent residents during the period suggest that we may expect similar proportions of people in residential aged care at high care levels in the future. After excluding the 2,491 residents whose dependency levels were not available, 62% of admitted permanent residents were classified as high care and 38% as low care (Table 4.25). These proportions are lower than those for existing residents (66% were high care and 34% were low care), although admitted residents are by definition at the beginning of their residential aged care stay – some will progress to higher levels of dependency in the course of their stay.

As would be expected, the dependency levels of residents who left residential care (through death or a move elsewhere) were much higher than those for both current and admitted residents (Table 4.30).

An interesting comparison is seen in the RCS 1 category. For separations there were 34%; for current residents there were 22%, whilst for new admissions there were 18% in that category.
