Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Survey

This survey collects information from the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population as part of the ABS Australian Health Survey. It combines the existing ABS National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Survey together with two new elements – a National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Nutrition and Physical Activity Survey and a National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Measures Survey.

Data from the Australian Cancer Database are used to report on national cancer statistics such as incidence, trends, projections, survival and prevalence. The AIHW is responsible for compiling data through the National Cancer Statistics Clearing House – a collaboration with the Australasian Association of Cancer Registries, with information received from hospitals; pathology laboratories; radiotherapy centres; and registries of births, deaths and marriages.

Life Tables for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians

Estimates of life expectancy are drawn from life tables published by the ABS. The ABS collection contains state, territory and Australian life tables for males and females for the reference period. It also contains life expectancy at birth estimates. A life table is a statistical model used to represent mortality of a population. In its simplest form, a life table is generated from age-specific death rates and the resulting values are used to measure mortality, survivorship and life expectancy.

National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Survey

The 2014-15 National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Social Survey is the fourth social survey of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians conducted by the ABS. The survey was conducted in all states and territories across *Remote* and *Non-remote* areas, and information was collected on a range of demographic, social, environmental and economic characteristics.

There are no strictly comparable non-Indigenous results available for the 2014-15 NATSISS. Where possible, the ABS provided recommendations for non-Indigenous data comparisons (such as the 2014-15 National Health Survey and the 2014 General Social Survey) and these have been adopted in this report.

The previous NATSISS was conducted in 2008 and the first survey, the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Survey (NATSIS) was conducted in 1994. Time series comparisons can be made although not all data elements align across the 3 surveys.

National Assessment Program—Literacy and Numeracy

Literacy and numeracy data are available from the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy

(NAPLAN).
